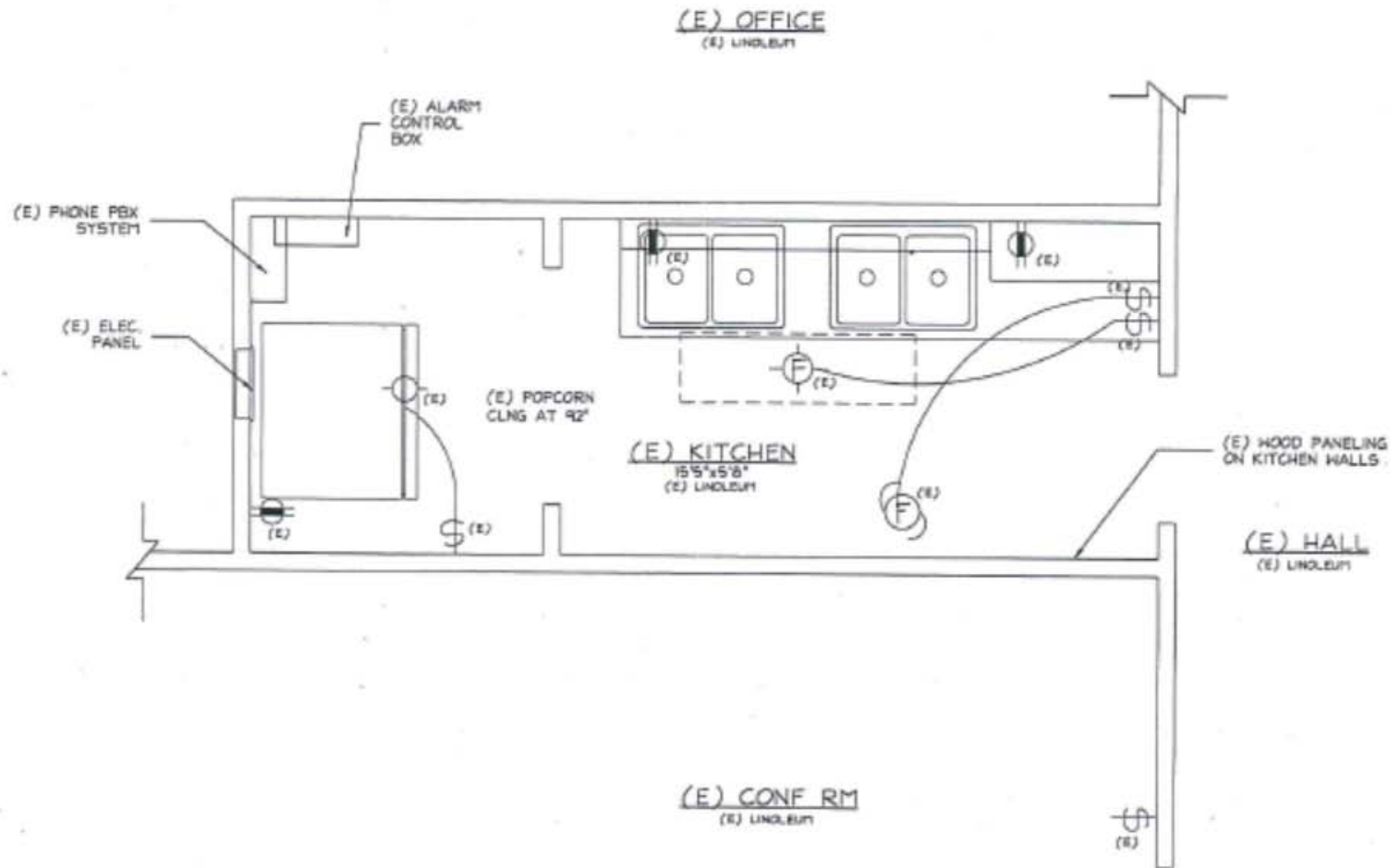
# Project Planning
